THE ORIGINAL JOURNALS OF THE LEWIS AND CLARK EXPEDITION

The Lewis and Clark Expedition: One of American history's greatest adventure stories.

By request of President Thomas Jefferson, in 1803, the Congress appropriated funds (\$2,800) for a small U.S. Army unit to explore the headwaters of the Missouri River and find an overland route to the Pacific Ocean by way of the Columbia River in an effort to increase fur trade with the Indians.

Meriwether Lewis was commissioned to lead the journey and invited friend William Clark, to join him on this epic journey. Both men were familiar with the frontier and with Indians through their service in the army. The explorers were to make a detailed report on western geography, climate, plants and animals, and to study the customs and languages of the Indians. In preparation, Lewis studied map making and learned how to fix latitude and longitude.

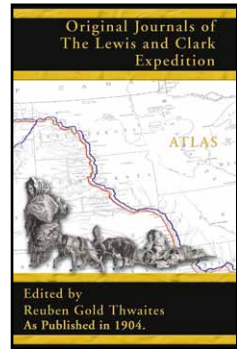
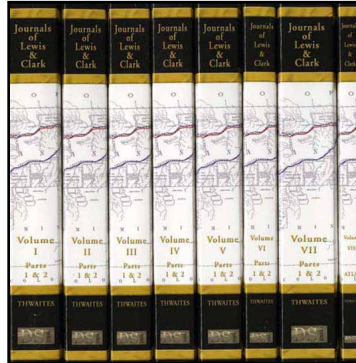
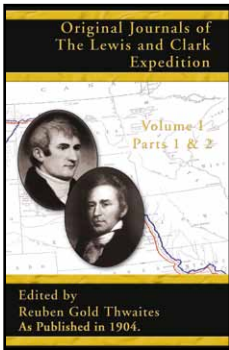
The "Corps of Discovery" departed from Camp Dubois on May 14, 1804. In 28 months, they covered over 6,000 miles, developed friendships with the Native Americans and learned how to survive in some of America's most beautiful and treacherous territories. Although they were believed dead, party successfully reached St. Louis on Sept. 23, 1806.

Lewis and Clark brought back much new material for mapmakers and specimens of previously unknown wildlife. American settlers and traders soon began to travel over the route they had blazed. The expedition also provided useful support for the United States claim to the Oregon country.

This digital reprint edition of the 1903-04 Original Journals of the Lewis and Clark Expedition is from the first edition of the journals printed eight years after their journey. It has been described as the most accurate, most elaborate work on the expedition.

Within the 16 parts of the 8 Volumes are letters by Lewis and Clark, the journals of the expedition members Serg. Charles Floyd and Private Joseph Whitehouse and an annotated bibliography compiled by Victor H. Paltsits, and an Atlas with the authentic maps illustrating the route of the expedition..

Edited and including an Introduction and Index by Reuben Gold Thwaites, this set is considered a valuable resource for historians, students and history buffs.



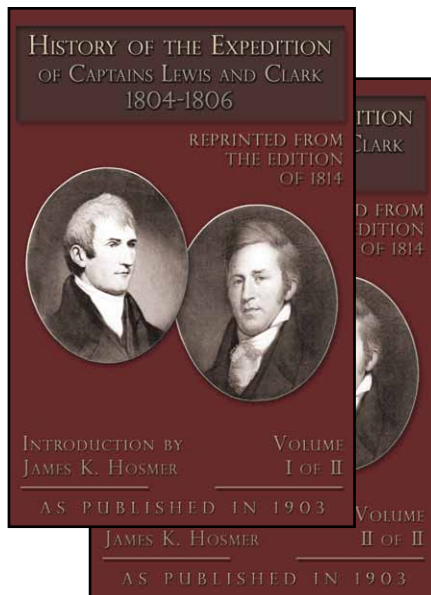

Catlin devoted his life to preserving the Indian heritage and spent many years traveling throughout the West sketching and painting. *The Young Reader's Catlin* in-

cludes a biographical sketch of Catlin along with sixteen illustrations from his initial work.

THE NORTH AMERICAN INDIANS

George Catlin was an American painter and writer. In 1823 he gave up his law practice to pursue his self-taught art, painting portraits in Philadelphia, Washington, D. C. and Albany, New York. After meeting a tribal delegation of Native Americans from the Far West he became eager to preserve the vanishing tribes and customs of the Native Americans through his art. Catlin traveled throughout the American West from 1832 to 1840. He sketched and painted hundreds of portraits, village scenes, religious rituals and games and wrote of his encounters with these fascinating people as he worked. The North American Indians features fifty-eight letters and 400 engraved illustrations from the author's original portraits, all in a two-volume set.

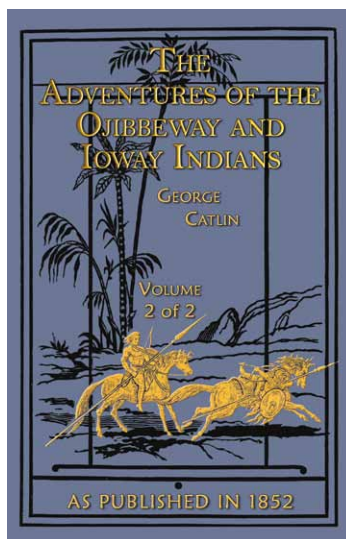
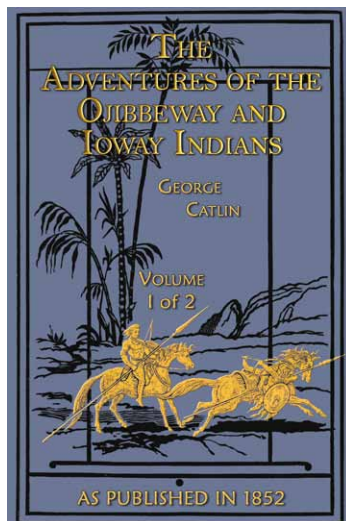

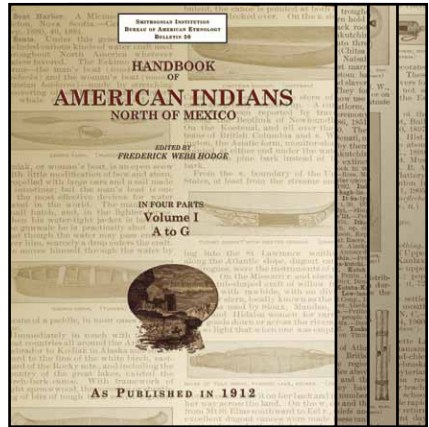
